Legislative Process:

November 2025 – 67 bills/LSR introduced

January/February 2026 – Reviewed the language of the bills and determined NHTCA position to **watch, oppose** or **support**

Demers/Prasol/Thomas – attends all hearings and signs in with the NHTCA position

Legal Council – Bernard Campbell – Also notifies NHTCA of bills of interest.

Legislative Chair w/ Executive Board – Formulate correspondences to the legislative Committee for bills NHTCA Opposes or Supports.

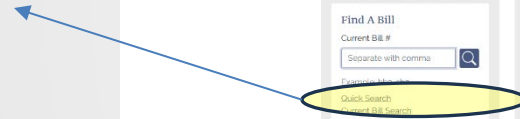
