January/February 2025 – Reviewed the language of the bills determined NHTCA position (**watch, oppose, support**)

Demers/Prasol/Thomas – attends all hearings and signs in with the NHTCA position

Legal Council – Bernard Campbell – notifies of bills of interest.

Legislative Chair w/ Executive Board – Formulate correspondence to the legislative Committees for bills NHTCA Opposes or Supports.

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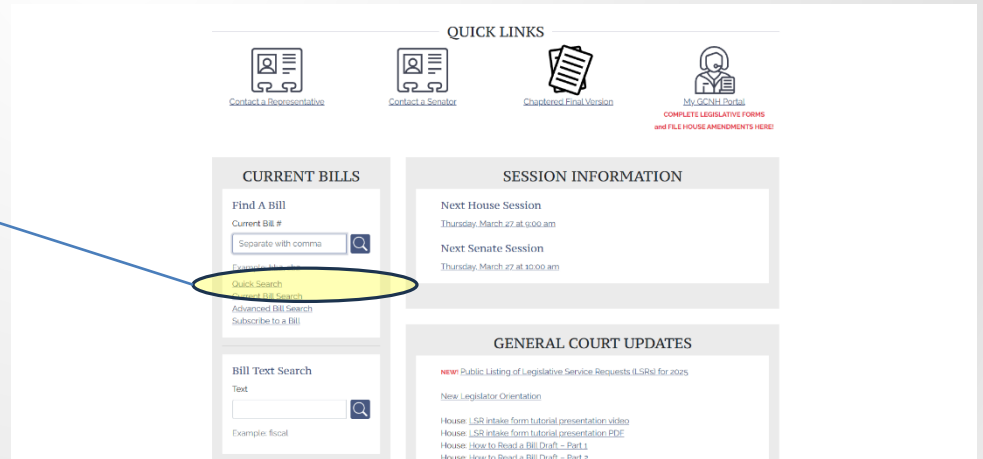
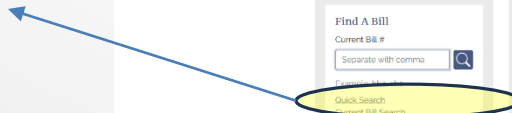


